

MEET THE SPEAKERS

JOVANA DIKOVIC



Dr. Jovana Diković is an economic anthropologist, Head of Sustainable Development and Inclusive Growth at CCRS, and lecturer at the Universities of St. Gallen and Fribourg. Jovana conducts research, writes and teaches on topics related to economic development and its constraints. This includes rural and agricultural development, post-conflict development, poverty reduction, emerging markets, and entrepreneurship. Her research area is primarily the Balkans, and as of recently, the DRC. Jovana is the author of two books *The Laissez-Faire Peasant: Post-Socialist Rural Development in Serbia* (UCL Press), *Why Development Cooperation Projects Fail: A Case Study of Post-Conflict Kosovo* (Springer Nature, forthcoming), and an editor of a volume *Sustainability of Development Assistance: Problems, Prospects and Perspectives* (CCRS). Her writings have appeared in publications aimed at the general public, such as *Mises*, *Schweizer Monat*, and Serbian weekly newspapers such as *Radar*, *NIN*, and online magazine *Katalaksija*.

ANGELO M. PETRONI



Angelo Maria Petroni (b. 1956) holds the chair of Logic and Philosophy of Science at the University of Rome, having previously held the same chair at the University of Bologna and taught at the Sorbonne (Paris-IV) and Bocconi University. He earned his Ph.D. at the Catholic University of Louvain under Jean Ladrière. Since 2007 he has served as Secretary General of Aspen Institute Italia, and since 2023 as founding Director of CONI's Advanced School of Olympic Specialisation. His past roles include General Director of Italy's National School of Public Administration and member of the executive board of RAI. A member of the Mont Pelerin Society since 1988, he has written extensively on the history and logic of scientific discovery, the methodology of the social sciences, and contemporary liberal thought.

DEIRDRE MCCLOSKEY



Deirdre Nansen McCloskey is Senior Fellow and holds the Isaiah Berlin Chair of Liberal Thought at the Cato Institute in Washington DC. From 2015 at the University of Illinois at Chicago she has been Distinguished Professor Emerita of Economics and of History, and Professor Emerita of English and of Communication. Trained at Harvard in the 1960s as an economist, she has written twenty five books and edited nine more, and has published some five hundred articles on economic theory, economic history, philosophy, rhetoric, statistics, feminism, ethics, law, and liberalism. She taught for twelve years at the University of Chicago in the Economics Department during its glory days, but now describes herself as a “literary, quantitative, postmodern, free-market, progressive-Episcopalian, ex-Marxist, Midwestern woman from Boston who was once a man.

TOM G. PALMER



Dr. Tom G. Palmer (b. 1956) is Executive Vice President for International Programs at Atlas Network, where he holds the George M. Yeager Chair for Advancing Liberty, and a Senior Fellow at the Cato Institute. He earned his B.A. from St. John's College, Annapolis, his M.A. in philosophy from the Catholic University of America, and his doctorate in politics from Oxford University. Before joining Cato, he was a vice president of the Institute for Humane Studies at George Mason University, and he has worked with civil society organizations promoting liberal democracy and market economics in every region of the world since the collapse of the USSR. He is the author of *Realizing Freedom: Libertarian Theory, History, and Practice*, co-author of *Development with Dignity* (2022, with Matt Warner) and *Institutions and Economic Development* (2023, with Bryan Cheang), and editor of widely translated volumes including *The Morality of Capitalism* and *Why Liberty*. His writing has appeared in scholarly journals such as the *Harvard Journal of Law and Public Policy* and *Ethics*, and in the *Wall Street Journal*, the *New York Times*, and *Die Welt*.



KEVIN BROOKES

Kevin Brookes is a lecturer at Sciences Po Paris and Director of the think tank Génération Libre. He teaches political science and the history of economic thought. He regularly comments on current political affairs in media outlets such as Le Point, L'Express, and Le Figaro.

He has worked at the French National Assembly, the French Senate, and within a political party as an adviser to elected officials.

He is the author of a doctoral thesis on the diffusion of liberal ideas in French political life, published as *Why Neo-Liberalism Failed In France* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2021), and of an essay on French political elites, *Que faire de nos élites politiques ?* (Plon, 2026).

ALAIN BERTAUD



Alain Bertaud is an urbanist and, since 2012, a senior research scholar at the NYU Marron Institute of Urban Management. He just completed writing a book about urban planning that is titled “Order Without Design: How Markets Shape Cities“. This book has been published by MIT Press in November 2018. Bertaud previously held the position of principal urban planner at the World Bank. After retiring from the Bank in 1999, he worked as an independent consultant. Prior to joining the World Bank, he worked as a resident urban planner in a number of cities around the world: Bangkok, San Salvador (El Salvador), Port Au Prince (Haiti), Sana’a (Yemen), New York, Paris, Tlemcen (Algeria), and Chandigarh (India).

Bertaud’s research, conducted in collaboration with his wife Marie-Agnès, aims to bridge the gap between operational urban planning and urban economics. Their work focuses primarily on the interaction between urban forms, real estate markets, and regulations.

KARL-FRIEDRICH ISRAEL



Karl-Friedrich Israel is Professor of Economics at the Université Catholique de l'Ouest (UCO) in Angers, France.

He previously served as a visiting professor at Saarland University in Saarbrücken and at the Institute for Economic Policy at Leipzig University, Germany.

He completed his undergraduate and graduate studies in Berlin, Paris and Oxford, before earning a doctorate in economics from the University of Angers in 2017, with a dissertation on the costs and benefits of central banking. He received his habilitation (HDR) from the University Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne in 2023 for his research on the neutrality of money and the unintended consequences of monetary policy.

RADU NECHITA



Radu Nechita is an associate professor who teaches Microeconomics, Globalization and Development, European Economic Integration at Babeş-Bolyai University, Cluj-Napoca, Romania (Department of European Studies). His general topics of interest gravitate around the institutional factors of development, with emphasis on regulations, monetary and fiscal policies. He promotes economic education in various forms: as a trainer in personal finance or in entrepreneurial education, by publishing dozens of articles in mass-media and by participating at over one hundred TV and radio shows. Since 2003, he organizes the “Friedrich von Hayek Seminar”, an extracurricular weekly series of interactive conferences, open to all students from Cluj-Napoca area.

NATHALIE JANSON



Nathalie Janson is an Associate Professor of Economics in the Finance Department at NEOMA Business School, and President of Génération Libre. She obtained her PhD in Economics from the University of Paris I-La Sorbonne in collaboration with the ESSEC PhD programme. She teaches courses in Economics, Money and Banking and Fintech Regulation in the initial training programmes in English Track. Her research focuses on monetary policy issues, banking regulation and crypto-currencies. Her research results have been published in academic journals such as World Economy, Geoeconomics, Banque et Stratégie/Revue Banque. She has been present in the media since the Greek crisis in 2015 and since 2019 particularly on crypto-currency issues.

DOUGLAS B. RASMUSSEN



Douglas B. Rasmussen is Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at St. John's University in NYC and Senior Affiliated Scholar at the Menard Family Institute for Economic Inquiry at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. Among the books he has co-authored (with Douglas J. Den Uyl) are: *Liberty and Nature: An Aristotelian Defense of Liberal Order* (1991); *Norms of Liberty: A Perfectionist Basis for Non-Perfectionist Politics* (2006); and *The Perfectionist Turn: From Metanorms to Metaethics* (2016). He has authored numerous articles in many scholarly anthologies and in such journals as: the *American Catholic Philosophical Quarterly*; *American Philosophical Quarterly*; *International Philosophical Quarterly*; *The New Scholasticism*; *The Personalist*; *Public Affairs Quarterly*; *Social Philosophy & Policy*; *The Review of Metaphysics*; and *The Thomist*. He has served on the Steering Committee of the Ayn Rand Society and as a member of Executive Council of the American Catholic Philosophical Association. He is co-editor (with Den Uyl) of *The Philosophic Thought of Ayn Rand* (1984). His areas of research interest are epistemology, ontology, ethics, and political philosophy as well as the moral foundations of capitalism. He has most recently coedited, *Defending Liberty: Essays in Honor of David Gordon* (Mises Institute, 2022)

PIERRE GARELLO



President of IES-Europe, Pierre Garello is Professor of Economics at the Law School of Aix Marseille University in France. He has published various articles on Austrian economics, law and economics (especially competition law and contract law), taxation and public economics. He is the editor-in-chief of the *Journal des Économistes et des Études Humaines*, a scholarly review dealing with economic, legal, philosophical and political issues, in the tradition of the French Classical Liberal School. He was the founder and Editor-in-Chief (until 2026) of *Journal des Libertés*, a review to popularise liberalism.

CHRISTIAN NĂSULEA



Christian Năsulea teaches Economics at the Department of International Relations and Universal History at the Faculty of History of the University of Bucharest. He is the Executive Director of the Institute for Economic Studies – Europe and a fellow of the Institute for Research in Economic and Fiscal Issues. His areas of research interest include public policy and stimuli for economic development, political and commercial negotiation in international relations, behavioural economics and decision processes. In addition to his university work he is also a tech entrepreneur, developing software and hardware solutions, but also learning resources for high school students who are interested in economics.

GREGORY REHMKE



Gregory F. Rehmke is Program Director for Economic Thinking. He has directed educational programs for high school, homeschool, and college students, and published articles on energy, environment, entrepreneurship and technology related topics, as well as on development economics. Mr Rehmke directed educational programs at the Center for the American Idea, The Reason Foundation, and the Foundation for Economic Education. Mr. Rehmke has a degree in Economics from the University of Washington. He has published articles in The Freeman, Reason, DailySpeculations.com, and the MasterResource blog. Mr. Rehmke is coauthor of the Complete Idiot's Guide to Global Economics.

EMMANUEL MARTIN



Emmanuel Martin holds a PhD in economics from Aix-Marseille University. His current research is on the dynamics of institutions. He teaches Economics and Public policies at Aix-Marseille University. He also teaches Macroeconomics and Microeconomics at Catholic Institute of Vendée. Emmanuel is a regular contributor to Geopolitical Information Service online. He is also a rock singer and guitarist and composes and plays with his band Debazine.

PIERRE BENTATA



Dr. Pierre Bentata is a French economist and essayist who teaches at the Faculty of Law of Aix-Marseille University. He holds an LL.M. in economics from the University of Hamburg and a doctorate in economics from Aix-Marseille, and his academic research focuses on the economic analysis of law and the regulation of environmental and digital risks, published in international peer-reviewed journals. Founder of the consultancy Rinzen and co-founder of the European think tank Cercle de Belém, he was previously a professor at the South Champagne Business School in Troyes and collaborates with the Institut Économique Molinari on public policy analysis. He is the author of several acclaimed essays, including *Les désillusions de la liberté*, *L'aube des idoles*, *De l'esprit de servitude au XXI^e siècle*, and *Tous notés!*, exploring how technological revolutions and economic crises shape culture and society. A regular commentator in the French media, he speaks frequently on economics, regulation, and public policy.

FRANÇOIS FACCHINI



Professeur agrégé des Universités en Sciences Economiques à l'Université Panthéon Sorbonne, il est membre du Centre d'Economie de la Sorbonne (CES). ANTOINE GENTIER



Antoine Gentier is Professor of Economics at Aix-Marseille University. He is also director of the Master's degree in Business, Law and Economics and Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Economistes et des Études Humaines, a scientific journal dedicated to the Austrian school of economics. His research interests include monetary and banking economics, bank management, financial and banking analysis of firms and banks, taking into account the contributions of the Austrian school of economics and free banking. He co-edited with François Facchini the book *L'École Autrichienne de A à Z* (The Austrian School from A to Z).

Her research explores how regulatory and technological changes in money, banking and finance affect privacy, freedom, and democracy. Alongside her career as an economist, she collaborates with her twin sister Carine Krecké on interdisciplinary projects blending visual arts and literature.



CARINE KRECKÉ

Carine Krecké is a Luxembourgish artist and author. For over two decades, she has developed conceptual art works on war, violence, and terrorism. Her projects probe investigative, quasi-forensic methods (open-source analysis and geospatial intelligence) within documentary and literary forms, blurring boundaries between reality and fiction, truth and fabrication, past and present, and even between author and protagonist. Her work has been presented in major international exhibitions.



CARLO LOTTIERI

Carlo Lottieri has taught the philosophy of law in Siena, Verona, and Lugano, and now teaches at Pegaso Telematic University. During his university years, he was a music critic for the Genoa daily newspaper ("Il Secolo XIX") and wrote a book on the sociology of music ("La musica e il villaggio", 1991). He is also the founder and director of the Röpke-Wojtyła Fellowship, a program dedicated to forming young Catholic intellectuals through the study of the market order and Catholic social thought.



ROMAIN MARSILY

Romain Marsily is a journalist, producer and media manager. After working for Canal+ and Vivendi, he headed Vice France. He notably produces the geopolitical news podcast Le Corse et l'Auvergnat. He teaches at Sciences Po Paris in the Master's in Communication, Media and Creative Industries. He is now CEO of Nouvelle Energie.

ZHANG ZHANG



In 2021, Zhang Zhang's article published in Le Figaro in defense of classical music against cancel culture was downloaded more than 120,000 times during its first week of publication. A committed advocate of universalism and equality, she pursues, through her humanitarian activities and artistic work, the building of bridges between cultures. For twenty-four years, Zhang Zhang was a member of the Monte-Carlo Philharmonic Orchestra. She is also a soloist at the Royal Opera of Versailles. Born in China during the Cultural Revolution, she was denied formal education until the age of eighteen, when she entered university directly, later earning two master's degrees, one from Rice University and another from the Conservatory of Lausanne. As the founder of Zhangomusiq, she has conceived and produced more than one hundred concerts supporting humanitarian, environmental, and educational projects in more than forty countries. As President of Skål International Monaco, she promotes responsible tourism based on dialogue and international cooperation. Her autobiography, *La voie de l'archet* (Fayard), received the Prix Parité Assurance in the "Destin de femme" category. A sought-after speaker, she is regularly invited by academic and international institutions including the French Ministry of National Education, the Collège de France, the EAIE, the Summit of Conscience, and TEDx. She is a columnist for *Le Droit de Vivre*, the universalist journal of the LICRA, and recipient of the Jean-Pierre-Bloch Prize in 2021, presented to her in Paris by H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco for her commitment to peace, universalism, and the fight against hatred and discrimination.

NICOLAS LECAUSSIN



Graduated from Sciences Po Paris, Nicolas Lecaussin (Bogdan Calinescu) was born in Romania. Having arrived in France in 1990, he has worked in the world of think tanks since 1997. He is currently the Director of the IREF (Institute for Economic and Fiscal Research), a European think tank based in Paris. A specialist in economic and political issues, he has written hundreds of articles and is the author of several books, including *This State That Is Killing France*, *Effective Absolutism*, *Help! They Want to Destroy Capitalism!*, *France, Europe, Romania*, *The French Anti-Liberal Obsession*, and *The Lesson-Givers*. He is also co-author of *What Are the Rich Good For?* (Lattès, 2012), *Anti-Piketty*, and *The Failure of the State*. He was awarded the 2015 Renaissance Prize in Economics for his book *The French Anti-Liberal Obsession*.

Terry Kibbe is the Co-Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Free the People, which uses pop-culture and video storytelling to turn on the "liberty curious." She was also a Senior Advisor to Alternative PAC, a SuperPAC which supported Libertarian Gary Johnson for President. She is the Co-Founder and Partner at Fight the Power Productions, a strategic communications firm focused on video production, social media branding, and compelling storytelling. Terry was also President of Curated Innovation, a medical research foundation delivering breakthrough products that save and improve lives. After graduating from Grove City College with a B.S. in Engineering, Terry spent the first decade of her career as an industrial engineer working with companies such as EDS and Unisys. Looking for a more personally fulfilling challenge, in 1997 she disrupted her own career, moving into the liberty-based nonprofit and philanthropic world.

MATT KIBBE



Matt Kibbe is the President and Chief Community Organizer of Free the People, a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting libertarian ideals. Prior to founding Free the People, he was the President of FreedomWorks.

JAMES TOOLEY



James Tooley was vice-chancellor at the University of Buckingham, where he is also professor of educational entrepreneurship and policy. Prior to joining the university in 2020, he was a professor of education policy at Newcastle University, where he directed the E. G. West Centre, which was dedicated to choice, competition, and entrepreneurship in education. He has done extensive work in demonstrating the benefits of private education for low-income families. Much of his work has focused on identifying ways to make private education more accessible and to facilitate its growth in the developing world, especially among the poor.



YORICK DE MOMBYNES

Yorick de Mombynes, born in 1975, is a senior French civil servant. He graduated from ESCP Business School and Sciences Po, holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from Paris-Sorbonne University, and is a graduate of the École nationale d'administration (ENA). He served as a technical advisor to François Fillon and also worked within TotalEnergies. He is the author of *La Philosophie esthétique d'Ayn Rand* (Institut Copet, 2014), with a foreword by Alain Laurent

PETAR GANEV



Petar Ganev is Senior Research Fellow at the Institute for Market Economics (IME) in Sofia, Bulgaria, where he has worked for more than 15 years. His interests are in the fields of growth and the business cycle, fiscal policy and the role of government, regional development, free markets and inequality. He also studies the history of the Austrian School of Economics. He served as Chairman of the Board of the Bulgarian Macroeconomics Association in 2016-2017 and has rich experience in public policy debates, authoring numerous articles in Bulgarian media. With the IME, he recently won the Europe Liberty Award (2024) for their successful campaign to change the Bulgarian constitution to curtail the powers of the prosecutor general and reduce the length of the term from seven years to five. He is also responsible for IME's educational initiatives. Petar is an IES-Europe Alumnus, having taken part in an IES-Europe Summer Seminar in Varna, Bulgaria in 2005; in 2011, thanks to his help, IES-Europe was able to return to Bulgaria as he acted as the link between IES-Europe and IME as a local organizer.

Dr. Eszter Nova received a PhD in International Political Economy from ELTE, Budapest. Journalist and blogger, she is currently Director of Objectivism studies at Cevro Institute, Prague. Her focus has been research on the impact of the economic crisis on democracy and the transatlantic policy of the US, on the psychology of authoritarian thinking and on the consolidation of third wave democracies.

Erwan Le Noan is a French economist and public policy expert specialising in competition, regulation, and institutional economics. He is recognised for his analytical work on the functioning of markets and the impact of regulatory frameworks on economic performance and public governance.

ANA SILVESTRU



Romanian pianist Ana Silvestru has established herself as a distinctive voice on the international classical music stage, acclaimed for the emotional depth of her interpretations. Her career spans prestigious solo and chamber performances across Europe, Asia, Africa and the Middle East, including appearances at Tonhalle Zürich, Bunkamura Orchard Hall Tokyo, St. Martin-in-the-Fields London, Gedächtniskirche Berlin, and the Romanian Athenaeum. She has collaborated with world-renowned musicians such as Alina Cojocaru, Johan Kobborg, Rainer Seegers, Fabio di Casola, Quinn Kelsey, Olga Kulchynska, Liviu Prunaru and Thomas Grossenbacher, and has developed interdisciplinary performances integrating music, film and literature. In 2021, Ana founded the Ana Silvestru Classics Association in Zurich, a cultural initiative fostering excellence in music education in Romania through masterclasses, concerts, and cultural exchange; its most significant achievement to date has been the invitation and successful appearance of Rainer Seegers, legendary solo timpanist of the Berlin Philharmonic, for a historic series of masterclasses and performances in Romania. Her discography includes the audiobook "Fremd bin ich eingezogen, fremd zieh' wieder aus" (Schubert's Winterreise, 2015) and the solo piano album "Irresistible Dreams of a Pianist" (Requiem Records, 2016). A graduate of the Zurich University of the Arts and the National University of Music Bucharest, she studied under Konstantin Scherbakov and Viniciu Moroianu, and was mentored by artists such as Lazar Berman, Dmitri Bashkirov, Daniel Fueter, Larissa Gergieva, Bernard Ringeissen, Fabio di Casola and Radovan Vlatkovic.

EDUARDO NOLLA



Eduardo Nolla is a professor of political theory and international consultant in higher education. He has held positions as researcher and professor at Yale University, vice-rector of San Pablo-CEU University, rector of Camilo José Cela University and academic director of the Ortega y Gasset Foundation. He is an internationally recognized authority on Alexis de Tocqueville and has been decorated by the Spanish, French and Colombian governments.

PHILIPPE NEMO



Philippe Nemo is a professor of political and social philosophy and historian of French political ideas at ESCP Europe. His fields of research range from liberalism, in particular Friedrich Hayek, of which he is the main French specialist, to the history of political ideas, the idea of the West and the republican idea. He has also published studies on the problem of education and contemporary pedagogy. Among his many works, some translated into several languages, are: *Job et l'excès du mal*, *La société de droit selon F. A. Hayek*, *Le Chaos pédagogique*, *Histoire des idées politiques dans l'Antiquité et au Moyen Âge*, *Histoire des idées politiques aux Temps modernes et contemporains*, and *Qu'est-ce que l'Occident?* He recently published *La philosophie de Hayek* (PUF, 2023). In 2016, he founded the École professorale de Paris with six other academics, which he has since directed.

LORD SYED KAMALL



Syed Kamall is a Conservative Member of the House of Lords. He is also a Professor of Politics and International Relations at St Mary's University, Twickenham. He is working with partner organisations to set up a UK version of Kiva to offer grants or loans to entrepreneurs from poorer communities, and is in discussions to build a network to assist local communities in setting up non-state neighbourhood civil society projects. He has served as the Minister for Technology, Life Sciences and Innovation in the Department of Health and Social Care and Minister for Civil Society, Heritage, Tourism and Growth in the DCMS. From 2005 to 2019, he was a Conservative MEP for London, where he was leader of the European Conservatives and Reformists group of MEPs from 19 countries, promoting open trade, tech start-ups and less but better financial regulation.
